SHOULD I CHOOSE A LANGUAGE /SCIENCE?

At this early stage it is good practice to choose a Language and Science to keep all your options open.

LANGUAGE ESSENTIAL FOR:

- AN ENTRY REQUIREMENT FOR ALL NUI UNIVERSITY COURSES (except engineering)
- NUI COLLEGES = UCC, UCD, UCG, Maynooth University and their constituent colleges.
- Medicine, Veterinary, Architecture, Dentistry, Speech Therapy etc. all require a language if studying in an NUI university

 Having a language provides a lot of choice and at this early stage in your education and it is a good idea to continue with it.



SENIOR CYCLE CONSIDERATIONS


- You may pick up a subject
